Statistical Data Report for May 2025, Released July 2025

State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were higher in May in 3 states, lower in 2 states, and stable in 45 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Twenty-four states and the district had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 4 states had decreases, and 22 states had little change. The national unemployment rate was unchanged at 4.2 percent but was 0.2 percentage point higher than in May 2024.

In May 2025, non-farm payroll employment was essentially unchanged in all 50 states and the District of Columbia. Over the year, non-farm payroll employment increased in 18 states and was essentially unchanged in 32 states and the district.

South Dakota had the lowest jobless rate in May, 1.8 percent. The District of Columbia had the highest unemployment rate, 5.9 percent, followed by Nevada, 5.5 percent, and Michigan, 5.4 percent. In total, 21 states had unemployment rates lower than the U.S. figure of 4.2 percent, 4 states and the district had higher rates, and 25 states had rates that were not appreciably different from that of the nation.

In May, three states had unemployment rate increases: Massachusetts (+0.2 percentage point) and Iowa and Virginia (+0.1 point each). Two states had rate decreases: Indiana and New York (-0.2 percentage point each). The remaining 45 states and the District of Columbia had jobless rates that were not notably different from those of a month earlier, though some had changes that were at least as large numerically as the significant changes.

In May 2025, non-farm payroll employment was essentially unchanged in all 50 states and the District of Columbia.
