## **Economic Growth Region 11**

Statistical Data Report for May 2013, Released July 2013

#### Regional and State Unemployment (seasonally adjusted)

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported regional and state unemployment rates were little changed in May. Twenty-five states had unemployment rate decreases, 17 states had increases, and eight states and the District of Columbia had no change. Forty-one states and the District of Columbia had unemployment rate decreases from a year earlier, four states had increases, and five states had no change. The national jobless rate was essentially unchanged from April at 7.6 percent but was 0.6 percentage point lower than in May 2012.

Nevada had the highest unemployment rate among the states in May, 9.5 percent. The next highest rates were in Illinois and Mississippi, 9.1 percent each. North Dakota again had the lowest jobless rate, 3.2 percent. In total, 21 states had jobless rates significantly lower than the U.S. figure of 7.6 percent, eight states and the District of Columbia had measurably higher rates, and 21 states had rates that were not noticeably different from that of the nation.






