Statistical Data Report for September 2025, Released December 2025

State Employment and Unemployment

Unemployment rates were higher in September in 8 states, lower in 2 states, and stable in 40 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Eighteen states and the District had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 9 states had decreases, and 23 states had little change. South Dakota had the lowest jobless rate in September, 2.0 percent. The District of Columbia had the highest unemployment rate, 6.2 percent. The next highest rate was in California, 5.6 percent. The national unemployment rate, 4.4 percent, changed little over the month but was 0.3 percentage point higher than in September 2024. Eighteen states and the District of Columbia had unemployment rate increases from September 2024, the largest of which was in Oregon (+1.0 percentage point). Nine states had over-the-year rate decreases, the largest of which was in Indiana (-0.7 percentage point).

In September 2025, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 1 state, decreased in 1 state, and was essentially unchanged in 48 states and the District of Columbia. Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 15 states and was essentially unchanged in 35 states and the District.






