State Employment and Unemployment

STATE EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT -- MAY 2024 Unemployment rates were lower in May in 4 states, higher in 3 states, and stable in 43 states and the District of Columbia, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Thirtythree states and the District had jobless rate increases from a year earlier, 2 states had decreases, and 15 states had little change. The national unemployment rate changed little at 4.0 percent but was 0.3 percentage point higher than in May 2023. Nonfarm payroll employment increased in 7 states and the District of Columbia and was essentially unchanged in 43 states in May 2024. Over the year, nonfarm payroll employment increased in 30 states and was essentially unchanged in 20 states and the District.







Real Earnings Summary


REAL EARNINGS – MAY 2024

Real average hourly earnings for all employees increased 0.5 percent from April to May. seasonally adjusted, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported . This result stems from an increase of 0.4 percent in average hourly earnings combined with no change in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). Real average weekly earnings increased 0.4 percent over the month due to the change in real average hourly earnings combined with no change in the average workweek. Real average hourly earnings increased 0.8 percent, seasonally adjusted, from May 2023 to May 2024. The change in real average hourly earnings combined with a decrease of 0.3 percent in the average workweek resulted in a 0.5-percent increase in real average weekly earnings over this period.
