

State Employment and Unemployment

STATE EMPLOYMENT AND UNEMPLOYMENT ---- The unemployment rate of the State of Indiana in March was recorded to be 4.1% according to the Indiana Department of Workforce Development. By comparison, the national unemployment rate reported for March was 4.2%.

In addition, Indiana's labor force participation rate is 63.7% compared to the national rate of 62.5%. This rate is the percentage of Hoosiers 16 and older that are either working or actively looking for work. Those not in the labor force include, primarily, students, retirees and other non-working populations, such as individuals unable to work due to a disability or illness, or adults responsible for their family's childcare needs. Indiana's total labor force stands at 3,484,094.

March 2025 total private employment is 2,834,600 an increase of 9,200 from the previous month.






