State Employment and Unemployment

Indiana July 2024 Employment Report

INDIANAPOLIS (August 16, 2024) - The unemployment rate of the State of Indiana in July stood at 4.0%, according to the Indiana Department of Workforce Development. By comparison, the national unemployment rate for July stands at 4.3%.

In addition, Indiana's labor force participation rate of 62.5% is now .1% higher than it was in June but still slightly below the national rate of 62.7%. This rate is the percentage of Hoosiers 16 and older that are either working or actively looking for work. Those not in the labor force include, primarily, students, retirees and other non-working populations, such as individuals unable to work due to a disability or illness, or adults responsible for their family's childcare needs.

Indiana's total labor force stands at 3,387,066.

Private sector employment in Indiana was unchanged over the last month. In July of 2024 Indiana reported 2,859,300 jobs.

Industries that experienced job increases in July included:

- Leisure & Hospitality (+ 2,000);
- Trade, Transportation & Utilities (+2,000);
- Construction (+ 1,400); and
- Professional and Business Services (+1,300).

As of July 16, 2024, there were 96,433 open job postings throughout the state. As of the week ending on July 27, 2024, Indiana had 20,275 continued unemployment insurance claims filed.







Nonprofits accounted for 12.8 million jobs, 9.9 percent of private-sector employment, in 2022 August 16, 2024

In 2022, over 300,000 nonprofit establishments in the country accounted for 12.8 million jobs, or 9.9 percent of private-sector employment. The District of Columbia had the highest percentage of nonprofit employment, 25.2 percent. Vermont, Massachusetts, Maine, New York, and Rhode Island also had high shares of nonprofit employment, with each reporting 17.0 percent or more of private employment in nonprofit organizations. Four states each had less than 6.0 percent: South Carolina, Texas, Alabama, and Nevada.




Montour County, Pennsylvania, had 63.8 percent of private employment in nonprofit organizations in 2022, the highest share among all U.S. counties. Tompkins and Franklin counties in New York ranked second and third highest with 49.3 percent and 40.8 percent, respectively.



These nonprofit data from the <u>Quarterly Census of Employment and Wages</u> and <u>Business Employment Dynamics</u> programs are now available from 2007 through 2022. They include employment, wage, and establishment figures for 501(c)(3) organizations at the national, state, metropolitan statistical area, and county levels. Industry estimates are also available.
